



1805


RSA founded, supported by member subscription. Women always allowed as members






RSA US

From ensuring education for all by creating the first public exams to promoting the need for conservation and sustainability, from seeking technological solutions to child labour to encouraging the planting of more than 60 million trees – social change is in our DNA.

We believe in a "not invented here approach" – leveraging our assets (brand/convening power, media influence, network effect) and making them accessible to our Fellows as part of a shared commons.







The evidence is clear: who one knows is just as important, if not more so, than what one knows. Social capital, the fabric of our relationships, trust, and community bonds, is now recognized as playing a crucial role in social mobility, associated with increased wealth, health, and happiness.

Unfortunately, America has witnessed a troubling decline in the strength of social ties and social mobility since the mid-century, leading to increased social isolation, alienation, lower life expectancy and an array of other societal determinants of health and wealth. This decline in social capital has significant implications for individual and community well-being, as well as for America's civic and political institutions, and society's resilience to shocks and crises.

We are social capital practitioners working to create and support connection within communities across class, age, gender, race, as well as additional human experiences, to bolster health, well-being, and economic mobility.
